Processed Commodities Support	<p>Cotton textile mills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 6 cents per pound based on mills average monthly cotton consumption for the historical period of 2017 through 2019 • Paid for 10 months from March 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 • Funds must be used for operating expenses • Upland and ELS cotton eligible 	<p>See above language allowing USDA to provide assistance to processors of agricultural commodities (this provision should allow for support to textile mills, renewable fuels plants, and others)</p>

	<p>Renewable fuel plants</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 45 cents per gallon for fuel produced Jan. 1 to May 1, 2020 • 45 cents per gallon for 50% of historical 2019 monthly production if plant was shut down during this period of 2020 	
<p>Commodity Credit Corporation/Charter Act</p>	<p>Amend Section 5 to include authority to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remove and dispose of surplus livestock due to supply chain disruptions • Aid agricultural processing plants to ensure supply chain continuity <p>CCC Oversight</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • USDA notify Congressional Agriculture Committees 90 days before any expenditure under the Charter Act except for farm bill authorized programs • GAO review, audit, and oversight of CCC activities and expenditures • 90-day notification will not apply if USDA receives written approvals for proposal from 3 of the following 4 Members of Congress: chair and ranking member of the House and Senate Agriculture Committees 	<p>No similar provisions, but above language should allow for USDA to make payments for the surplus disposal of livestock due to processing disruptions</p>
